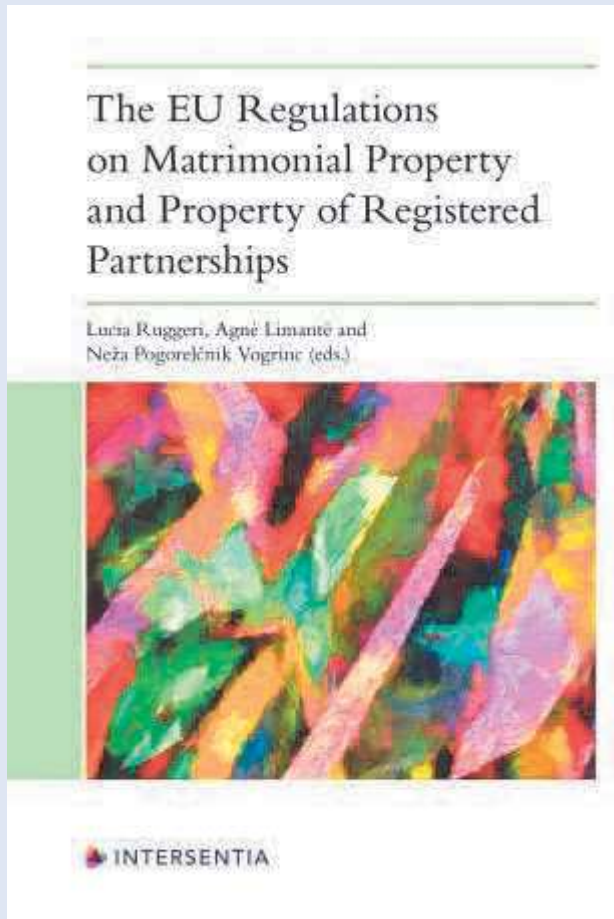


The EU Regulations on Matrimonial Property and Property of Registered Partnerships
